The Career Education Center sponsors **Hoya Career Connection (HCC)**, an online career management system for all full-time and internship career postings for Georgetown students. HCC also allows employers to register for on-campus interviews, career fairs and schedule events. Use of HCC is free of charge.

Use Hoya Career Connection to target the following Georgetown student populations:

- Currently enrolled, degree-seeking undergraduate students
- Alumni of the non-professional schools, and
- Graduate students in the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences.

The professional schools (MBA, Law, Medicine, and the Graduate School of Foreign Service) maintain separate job databases. *See the Contacts section (page 5) for information about additional career centers.*

The network is intended to supplement Hoya Career Connection (HCC) and to provide employers with greater industry and geographical options.

Only currently enrolled, degree-seeking students of the non-professional schools are eligible to apply for positions that are interviewing on campus.

Recruiting Policies

The Georgetown University Career Education Center has developed the following policies to ensure that the recruiting process is fair and straightforward for both employers and students consistent with the National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE) "[Principles for Professional Conduct for Career Services & Employment Professionals](#)."

The principles are designated to provide practitioners with three basic precepts for career planning and recruitment:

1. Maintain an open and free selection of employment and experiential learning opportunities in an atmosphere conducive to objective thought, where job candidates can choose to optimize their talents and meet their professional objectives;
2. Maintain a recruitment process that is fair and equitable; and
3. Support informed and responsible decision making by candidates.

Job Postings

Employment professionals will only post opportunities that require college-educated candidates, in a manner that includes the following:

- a. All postings should adhere to EEO compliance standards;
- b. Job postings should be suitable and appropriate for Georgetown University students;
- c. Internship postings should meet the U.S. Department of Labor definition and criteria for internships. (See [U.S. Department of Labor Wage and Hour Division Fact Sheet #71: Internship Programs Under The Fair Labor Standards Act](#).)

The Career Education Center reviews all employer registrations and position descriptions and reserves the right to make a determination of the appropriateness of the positions being offered for the population it serves.

Third-Party Recruiters

Third-party recruiters – including agencies, organizations or individuals recruiting candidates for employment opportunities other than for their own needs will disclose information as follows:

- a. Disclose to students the name(s) of the client(s) that the recruiter is representing and to whom the students' credentials will be disclosed.
- b. When deemed necessary, will disclose information upon request to the Career Education Center that would enable verification that it is recruiting for a bona fide job opportunity.

Non-Discrimination

Georgetown University does not discriminate against any person on the basis of race, color, gender, sexual orientation, age, religion, national or ethnic origin, marital status, veteran status, or handicap in admissions to, access to, treatment in, or employment in its programs and activities. Employers must comply with Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) guidelines.

Confidentiality

Employment professionals will maintain the confidentiality of student information, regardless of the source, including personal knowledge, written records/reports, and computer data bases. There will be no disclosure of student information to another organization without the prior written consent of the student, unless necessitated by health or safety considerations.

Recruiting Policies

Eligible Students

All currently enrolled, degree-seeking Georgetown University undergraduates and College of Arts & Sciences graduate students may participate in the On-campus Interviewing (OCI) program. Please contact a member of the Recruiting Team with any questions regarding student eligibility.

Second-Round Interviews

To ensure that students have equal access to employers, the Career Education Center requires that all second-round interviews accommodate the student's classes and previously scheduled first-round interviews. Students should not be asked, nor be expected to, cancel a first-round interview or miss a class to attend a second-round interview. Without exception, **employers must offer alternative dates**, without negative consequences, for a second-round interview if the date originally offered by the employer interferes with a student's first-round interview on campus, class, or other valid conflict.

Employers must notify students at least 48 hours in advance of a second-round interview **if it is outside the DC Metro Area**. It is the employer's responsibility to coordinate second-round interviews with students. Do **not** make travel arrangements for students before conferring with them. It is customary for employers to reimburse students for travel expenses incurred to interview. If applicable, please indicate your policy when inviting a student to interview. **Students may still have academic commitments on open days.*

Recruiting Policies

Offer Deadlines

All employers who participate in on-campus interviewing at Georgetown (which includes all interviews with students who have applied through Hoya Career Connection), must follow these policies without applying pressure to respond to an earlier date. It is important to keep students informed of their status throughout the process.

Exploding offers and bonuses put enormous pressure on students to make a decision before they are ready. Students must be allowed to complete the interview process prior to making a decision to accept an offer of employment.

The dates listed below must be included in the written offer. All employers should extend offers in writing and be prepared to exhibit written offers to the recruiting team.

These dates also apply to any employers who interview and extend offers outside the on-campus interviewing cycle. Violation of the offer dates may impact date reservation for the next recruiting cycle.

**Bonuses and other incentives associated with an offer cannot expire before the dates above.*

On occasion, students may request an extension beyond the dates given. It would be our hope that each request would be considered on a case by case basis, and would be accommodated as possible. Please feel free to reach out to a member of the Recruiting Team to discuss any questions or concerns related to the Offer Deadline policy.

Recruiting Policies

Rescinding or Deferring Employment

Employers needing to rescind or defer employment should carefully review the guidelines and follow the NACE recommendations found in their Position Statement on Rescinded and Deferred Employment Offers. The NACE guidelines urge employers to adopt a two-part approach to employment offers under consideration for revocation. The first emphasizes the need for a commitment to high standards in recruiting. The second offers a reasoned approach to dealing with rescinded and deferred offers.

NACE recommends that employers who must revoke a commitment consider alternatives that do not require rescinding employment offers. These may include changes in job responsibilities, salary reduction or reduced workweeks, changes in job locale, delayed starting dates, and other reasonable options.

For candidates whose start dates are deferred:

- Provide services to aid the candidates in securing other employment
- Provide financial assistance if the deferral will be longer than three months
- Communicate to candidates as soon as possible
- Contact the Career Education Center
- Stay in communication with candidates and the Career Education Center regarding start dates

The Career Education Center expects all employers to treat candidates in an ethical manner. We reserve the right to deny access to on-campus interviewing to any employers who we determine have not conducted their recruiting efforts ethically.

Report Hiring Data

We require employers who recruit Georgetown students to inform us of all offers of employment that are extended to students in order to ensure that we maintain accurate statistics regarding student employment. This includes both full-time and internship offer data. Individual employer detail is kept strictly confidential and is used for statistical reporting purposes only.

ALL EMPLOYERS WILL BE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT HIRING DATA FOR THE PREVIOUS YEAR PRIOR TO RESERVING ON-CAMPUS INTERVIEW DATES FOR THE 2012-2013 RECRUITING SEASONS.

Email Policy

Georgetown University does not permit blanketing students with emails. Only those students who have given your organization their email address should be solicited.

Inclement Weather

In the case of inclement weather, the operating status of the university will be listed on the university's homepage www.georgetown.edu. Please be in close contact with the Recruiting Team to discuss how to proceed.

Each provides an excellent opportunity for you to meet students and for students to learn more about your organization. Information Sessions

Info Sessions are scheduled between 5-7 p.m. or 7-9 p.m. and are typically held 2-3 weeks prior to on-campus interviews or the expiration of a job posting on Hoya Career Connection (HCC). This type of event works best for those organizations with an established brand on campus.

B. Career Education Center Presentation Spaces

A limited number of small information sessions can be held in the seminar rooms at the Career Education Center.

There is a \$200 charge for presentations in the seminar rooms. A/V equipment can be rented for \$50. All rooms and equipment are available on a first-come, first-served basis, and must be booked through HCC at least 10 business days before the event.

- **Seminar Room One:** holds 40 people and is available Mondays-Thursdays from 5-7 p.m.
- **Seminar Room Two:** holds 20 people and is available Mondays-Thursdays from 5-7 p.m.
- For government and non-profit organizations, the **Leavey Program Room** can be reserved on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 5-7p.m. free of charge.

NOTE: For all events in the Career Education Center, please submit a date request in HCC. The Recruiting Team will contact you to confirm event details and secure your reservation.

Educational Events

Engage more students by hosting educational events on campus. Partner with our office to help students learn about your industry and prepare for their careers.

Industry 101/Career Panel

Generate interest about your industry by providing an inside look on current trends and challenges. Share advice about your industry.

Mock Interview Program

Help students with their interview skills by setting up a day to come to campus and host mock interviews in our interview space off-cycle from on-campus interviewing.

Office Hours

Build relationships with potential applicants through short one-on-one conversations about your company. Students can sign-up in advance and the office hours can be held in our interview space off-cycle from on-campus interviewing.

Coffee Chats

This is a great way to get to know students in an informal setting. We recommend that you host these coffee chats outside the student-owned coffee shop, Uncommon Grounds.

Tabling

Contact the Career Education Center to reserve a table for your organization. Set up with food or giveaways to attract students in the high traffic areas of the Leavey Center Commons or Red Square.

Parking on Campus

There are two main parking structures at Georgetown University. Access to each is depends upon your entry route onto campus.

Leavey Center Garage:

A limited number of visitor parking spaces are available on an hourly or daily basis at the Leavey Center P-1 or Lot A. These spaces are managed separately by the Georgetown University Hospital and can be reached by entering campus from the Reservoir Road Entrance 1. The fee is hourly with a \$25 per day maximum (cash only).

Southwest Garage:

A limited number of daily parking spaces are available in the Southwest Garage for a flat rate of \$18 per day (cash only) and can be reached by entering campus from Canal Road. You must pay when you enter the garage to park.

Getting to the Career Education Center once on campus**From GU Hotel & Conference Center:**

- Walk through the double doors in the main lobby, down the long corridor hallway (past Starbucks and Cosi)
- Turn right at the end of the hallway
- Follow the hallway past Capital One, through the food court, past Uncommon Grounds and the student lounge (keeping them on your right)
- The Career Education Center is located across the hall from the campus bookstore.

From the Southwest Garage:

- Exit the garage.
- Walk up the sidewalk along the football field.
- Enter the McDonough School of Business building (blue stone building at the top of the hill)
- Go to 3rd floor of the building via stairs or elevator.
- Cross the esplanade to enter into the Hotel and Conference Center and turn right.
- Pass the conference rooms and Faculty Club on your left.
- Continue through the double doors into the students lounge and turn immediately left.
- Follow the short hallway and make a right.
- The Career Education Center is on the right just before the exit to the campus.
